Maximum Contaminant Level or MCL: The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal or MCLG: The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected

Treatment Technique or TT: A required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Federal Action Level: The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatmen or other requirements which a water system must follow. MCL's are set at very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described from the many regulated constituents, a person would have to drink 2 liters of water every day at the MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

Coliforms are bacteria that are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially-harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.

- \*\* System repaired, disinfected & flushed. Subsequent samples were satisfactory.
